<u>Principals Report:</u> it is a fantastic year with the climate and tone of the school full of positive energy. Semester one ends on Thursday Jan.23, semester two will begin on Friday jan.31. Although there are no classes during semester break some students will be writing provincial exams and teachers will be in the school and available to all students. The Festival of Arts and Dance takes place this Wed, Thur, Fri. Tickets are now on sale for the Winter Formal (a dance for grades eleven and twelve) which will be held on February 13th. The grade seven course selection evening has been tentatively booked for the evening of Feb 18th. The developer of the Summit Construction Project adjacent to the school will be holding an open house on February 26th. This will be an opportunity to see what this area will look like as future development occurs. -Cobbs bread pick-up. The bread provides food for the school's breakfast program, afterschool programs, forgotten lunches and snacks. A list was circulated for parents to sign up.

-an article from the Burnaby Now Newspaper was highlighted. It recognised a group of girls from Byrne Creek that are involved in an after school leadership program "empowering a new generation". They provide leadership to younger girls in the school and are now helping grade seven girls transition from Stride Elementary to the more overwhelming environment of Secondary School. -the grads are selling ceiling tiles for eight dollars each. The purchasing student is then able to paint their tile and it will be reinstalled in the ceiling of the atrium.

-many community partners helped with the success of the Hamper Drive this year. Extras were delivered to Armstrong and Windsor schools as their hampers had been compromised with expired food items. The students showed great understanding of the greater community by including these other schools in their success and are clearly showing that Byrne Creek students think and act beyond their own walls.
