Between 80-100 people attended. May 7<sup>th</sup>, 2016 Tea Talks were cancelled, moved to next school year.

#### - DAC report

- Vicky Ma (Community member) and Gayle Beavil (Maywood Coordinator) presented highlights of the new community schools educational video. It should be available to us in September. Discussion on what else we could do to educate the community. It was suggested that DAC should provide Community Schools 101 workshops similar to PAC 101. We also need to teach new teachers about community schools as part of the orientation process.
- Wanda Mitchell (Assistant Superintendent) presented the 2016-2017 Budget for Community schools. The formal request was to include in the City's operating budget, the sum of \$464,923 as its share of the funds required to support Burnaby's Community School program for the 2016/2017 school year. The increase is \$4,267.
