The Community Council of Byrne Creek (formerly known as the Parent Advisory Council) welcomes all families to the 2018 – 2019 school Year. We hope you had a restful summer and are ready for the new and exciting challenges in this new school year. We encourage parents and community involvement at Byrne Creek. We believe that student success is achieved when we have a community that is involved and engaged.

If you are a parent or guardian of a student attending Byrne Creek Community School, if you live or work in the community you are entitled to belong to our Community Council. Our goals for this school year are to enhance relationships and partnerships with the greater community thus increasing engagement and creating healthy and safe communities and providing community education.

What Are Community Schools and What is Happening at Byrne Creek?

A Community School is the hub of the community. It is people, a place and a set of partnerships between the school and other community resources. Its integrated focus on school success, child and youth development, family support, and community development leads to improved student learning, stronger families and vibrant healthy communities.

At Byrne Creek we focus on:

Health and Wellness: Considering the whole child and community to support mental, emotional, physical health with programs such as Leave Out

Violence, Breakfast program for all students, Snacks and Lunch programs, connecting families/students to health resources such as Dental, eyeglasses etc.

Community Development: Creating a sense of belonging for parents and community members by providing opportunities for learning and connecting. Examples: Dinners for families, workshops through the community room, Community Council meetings with parent education sessions, parent tea, youth are active in planning community events such as seniors tea, multi cultural dinners, assisting at school run events.

Lifelong Learning: Providing opportunities for all community members to develop and share their skills and passions through the Council, Community Room, Alumni return to participate in events and coach sports teams, Parents offering workshops, after school programs, mentoring with feeder schools, programs with feeder schools.

Social/Emotional Learning: We encourage the development of connected positive relationships, leading to academic and overall success. Examples: Friends of Simon and Frontier College tutoring, Red Cross Health Teen Relationships.

ALL OF THESE 4 ELEMENTS ARE INCLUDED IN BYRNE'S STRATEGIC PLAN (School Goals).

What is Byrne Creek Community Council and What Does It Do?

At Byrne Creek our council is dedicated to education and the well-being of the whole child and the community. We host monthly meetings for the parents and the community, provide parent education through guest speakers, volunteers at school events and serves in an advisory role to the school. We are not a fundraising body although fundraising is an activity that is undertaken by most Councils to support extracurricular activities.
