June is Pride Month. This month is to recognize members of the lgbtqia2s+ community who have been discriminated against. It is a month to celebrate equality, acceptance, how far we have come, as well as how far we still need to go.

We celebrate Pride in June as it is the anniversary of the stonewall uprising that helped set the path towards equality. In the late 1960s being homosexual or genderqueer was prohibited. In 1969, in San Francisco, the Stonewall inn, a place with very diverse clientele was raided and the days following lead to rioting and protest that is now known as the Stonewall Uprising.

A year later thousands of people went out to honor this event and it is considered the first ever pride event. Pride month began as gay pride day, celebrated on the last Sunday of June and then more and more events started to be planned so that in 1999 June was announced as Pride Month to celebrate the achievements we've made.

It is important to acknowledge this month because while we have come a long way it is still not perfect, and we have a lot to work on. A study done says 87% (majority) of students who are sexually and/or gender diverse experience harassment and/or assault. This makes depression and suicide more common in queer youth. Diverse youth are significantly more likely to experience frequent bullying, especially transgender and/or non-binary folks attracted to same gender individuals rather then cisgender people attracted to opposite gendered persons.

In conclusion, we would you to honor this month and be inclusive to everyone around you. On June 14, Byrne Creek will be raising the Pride Flag for the first time. We invite everyone in the school community to come join us at lunch to celebrate the flag raising.
