4 Minimum Requirements of CLC

- Career life development (resume writing, post secondary planning, goal setting)
- 30 hours community work (work experience / volunteering/ part time job)
- Capstone project in Grade 12 (student selected project)
- Capstone presentations begin in January.

Options for Work experience.

- 30 hours of community work
 - Minimum requirement for graduation.
 - Work experience, volunteering, part time job
- 80 hour work experience.
 - 2-year program starting in grade 11
 - School arranged unpaid work experience.
 - Counts as grade 12 elective course (4 credits)
- Youth Train in Trades programs (District Program with application process)
 - Specialized training program with 120 hours work experience.
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Youth Training Programs

- Youth Train in Trades (Industry Training Authority Required)
 - Automotive Service Technician, Carpenter, Construction, Electrician, professional cook, hairstyling
- PSI Youth Train in Trades (Post Secondary Institute training)
 - involves post secondary for trades training.
 - auto collision and refinishing, baker, landscaping, metal fabricator, painter, plumber, sheet metal worker
- Industry certificate programs
 - CISCO networking academy, ECE, Fitness instructor, Microsoft specialist, Palo Alto cybersecurity academy, tourism, and event management
- Industry Connect Programs (portfolio building)

Principal Report

- Hamper drive. Over 200 hampers organized and delivered to families
- VPA department. Band and drama departments did productions in December. Community saw presentations in day, parents at evening.
- Dance production at MJ Fox last Friday
- January 15th Black Excellence Day. Byrne hosted the virtual and in-person provincial event. 10,000s of students, teachers, trustees, and district leaders from 16 school districts joined the event virtually from around the province. was host of the provincial super intendant, minister of education, students from lower mainland in attendance. Speakers, musicians, food
- Reminder to drive safely around school. 30km roads by school. 10km on school grounds. No parking in fire lane (rainbow crosswalk in front of school). Please park in parking lot to wait for students.
- Semester end coming up. Shortened alternate week Wednesday Jan 24 Friday January 26. No school but students can come in to finish projects or rewrite tests. No school Monday, January 29th. New semester begins Tuesday, January 30.
- Open house January 25th. Course offerings for next year.

Laurent Scaligine (Vice Principal)

Assessment / semester turnaround week.

- Staff voted to change and shorten from what was previously on calendar.
 - January 23, 24, 25 Grade 12 Literacy (for grade 12 students currently taking English), Numeracy 10, Literacy 10.
- Friday, January 26 CAP Stone presentations.
- Grade 7 visits Jan 23-26.
- Semester turn around time Students can also catch up on school work and rewrite tests.

- More assessments will in April and June.
- No grade 12 numeracy assessment. Just grade 10 (BC wide)

Lock down procedures.

- Letter going out tomorrow going over lock down procedures. Some updates to the procedures will be outlined in the letter. Last year there was a real lock down at Burnaby Mountain and after this real life situation school district realized they needed to updated some areas of their lock down procedures.
 - Why they do a lock down (someone has come into the building)
 - Teachers to lock doors, turn off lights, turn down blinds and everyone to be quiet.

 - February 8th at 2pm Lock down drill at Byrne.

TREASURERS REPORT - SAM N

- Gaming account cheque for \$2325 came out (cheque was to Byrne for approved gaming grant expenditures)
- general account balance 2 cheques for \$500 each came out (scholarship cheques from June)/
- Effie forwarded a late Gaming Grant request from Ms. Mizuno, Indigenous Success teacher. Request was for t-shirts, field trip and money for snacks and food. We discussed that no clubs or teams were provided funds for food or snacks so this was not considered.
 - \$300 for T-shirts for Indigenous Leadership team and \$140 for Field Trip was voted on and **approved.** Sam will inform teacher and Byrne's bookkeeper.
- It was discussed at the meeting to be noted in meeting minutes that **Tasha Murray** (Secretary) will be <u>added</u> as signing authority and **Sandra Mederios** will be <u>removed</u>. Sandra was recently hired by the Burnaby School District and now works at the high school and can't be on the Executive or have signing authority. Tasha will make arrangements at the bank to be added.

DPAC REPORT - MEL P.

DPAC (district pac) hold a monthly meeting for a representative from each Burnaby school to attend.

- Emotional regulation. How we can use conflict vocabulary at home, keep calm when dealing with kids at home. Grounding self wanting parents to regulate themselves first before dealing with their kids.
- Ask your kids 3 questions. Do you need me to offer advice? Do you need me to get involved? Do you need me to just listen?
- Got very uncomfortable at meeting. DPAC chair resigned. Executive did not share back story about what was happening. No meeting minutes from past meetings. People missing from executive. Many parents in audience got up and left.
- Discussion from parents that there is no space in our schools. What can we do about this?
- Discussion about by-laws and constitution.
