PRINCIPAL'S REPORT – BEN PARÉ

A number of events are coming up:

- January 20- 24 alternate schedule week will include times for assessments (see below), students with I.E.s will have time to see teachers as needed, AP review classes, Grade 12 capstone project presentations, and open gym
- 3 Mandatory Provincial Assessments are graduation requirements: Literacy 10, Numeracy 10, Literacy 12. These test broad foundational skills; students can't study for them. Letters are coming home to applicable families this week about assessments. For more information:

Parents asked about criteria for grade 12 capstone projects. Parents with graduated students who presented capstones in previous years shared experiences. Ben will add this topic to a list of agenda items to cover at a future Council meeting so that families have more information about expectations for capstone projects.

STEAM is not running at Byrne Creek next year; teachers were not keen to continue it due to several challenges.

UBC and SFU recently changed their second language requirements for undergraduate admission – starting for fall intake 2026, SFU and UBC will remove grade 11 language requirements.

There were questions about band timetabling for the 2025-2026 school year. This is undetermined for next year. This is the first year that the junior band is outside of the timetable (it was combined with senior band which has always been outside the timetable). There is big concern from visual and performing arts departments within the Burnaby secondary schools that are moving to a 5-period schedule next year (Byrne will not be impacted by the change).
