BYRNE CREEK STUDENT EXPECTATIONS

CODE OF CONDUCT & SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

We are committed to maintaining a safe, caring, inclusive, and respectful learning environment. All students are expected to be respectful of themselves, others, the school, and the community by demonstrating a sense of ethics, and upholding human rights. Students should use language that is respectful and free from vulgarity, profanity, and discriminatory remarks related to race, religion, disability, and/or gender identity. Students must not engage in behaviour that interferes with the learning of others, including bullying, harassment, intimidation, discrimination, threats, violence or retaliation. These expectations apply both in person and online. **At secondary schools, personal digital devices must be stored on silent mode and kept out of sight during instructional time unless authorized by a teacher for educational purposes or required for accessibility.**

ATTENDANCE & PUNCTUALITY

Students are expected to attend classes regularly and arrive on time. Regular attendance and punctuality support student learning and contribute to a positive learning environment for all. Permission to leave school must be obtained through the office by either a phone call, email or note from a parent/guardian. Students arriving late should report directly to class. If a parent/guardian has notified the school, the student will be marked excused. If no notification has been received, the absence or lateness will be recorded as unexcused, and an automated email will be sent home.

SAFETY – Smoking, Vaping, Weapons & E-scooters

To support a safe and healthy school environment, smoking, vaping, and the use of tobacco or vaping products are **not permitted** in the school, on school grounds, or at school-sponsored activities for all students, staff, and visitors. The possession, use, or distribution of illegal or restricted substances, weapons, or replica weapons is strictly prohibited. Legally, E-scooter riders must be at least 16 years old.

CONSEQUENCES

Every effort will be made to support students and understand the factors contributing to inappropriate behaviours. The severity and frequency of unacceptable conduct, along with the age, maturity and individual circumstances of the student, will be considered when determining appropriate interventions and consequences. Responses to unacceptable conduct will be fair, consistent and reflective of the circumstances of each situation. Whenever possible, incidents will be resolved by discussion, mediation and restitution for each individual student.
